

Oklahoma Expungement Statutes

There are five (5) expungement statutes provided by Oklahoma law:

1. Title 22, § 18: A general provision which applies to the expungement of court and law enforcement records if the person falls within a specific category,
2. Title 22, § 991(c): Applies to the expungement of court records after the successful completion of the conditions of a deferred sentence,
3. Title 22, § 60.18: An expungement provision provided by the Protection from Domestic Abuse Act which authorizes the expungement of victim protective orders (VPOs) if the individual falls within one of four categories,
4. Title 63, § 2-410: Authorizes the expungement of court records after the successful completion of probation and a treatment/rehabilitation program for first-time narcotic offenders, and
5. Title 10, § 7307-1.8: Allows the expungement of juvenile records of persons subject to an open juvenile court record.
